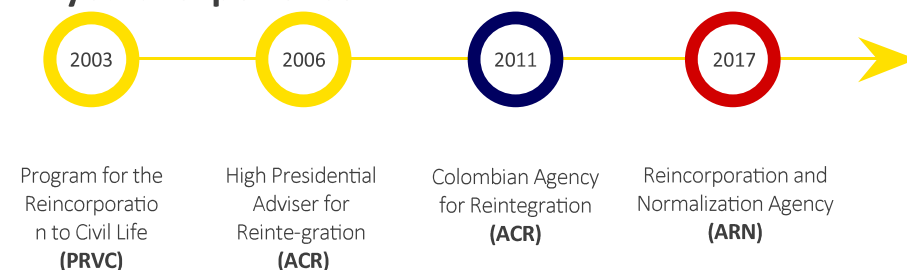


OUR ENTITY

The Reincorporation and Normalization Agency (ARN) leads the design and implementation of the public policy for the reinsertion, reintegration and reincorporation of people who were part of illegal or organized armed groups, with a territorial and community approach, respectful of the ethnic, cultural and social diversity of the country. ARN bases its activities on the needs of the former combatants, promotes the guarantee of their rights, the coexistence and reconciliation in the territories.

OUR PROCESSES

Regular Reintegration

This process contemplates a comprehensive approach to the people in the reintegration process and their family through eight dimensions (personal, family, health, education, production, security, citizenship and habitat), which affect the development and strengthening of capacities leading to the autonomous exercise of citizenship within the framework of legality.

Special Reintegration

It promotes the reintegration of people postulated to Law 975 of 2005 once they have recovered freedom effectively through access to benefits such as psychosocial counseling, education and training for employment to allow them to continue to live under the framework of legality and meet the commitments acquired with the victims in terms of symbolic reparation.

Reincorporation

Comprehensive and sustainable process of an exceptional and transitional nature that considers the interests of the Farc-Ep community in the reincorporation process, its members and their families. It is aimed at strengthening the social fabric in the territories, promoting coexistence and reconciliation among those who inhabit them, and fostering productive activity and local democracy.

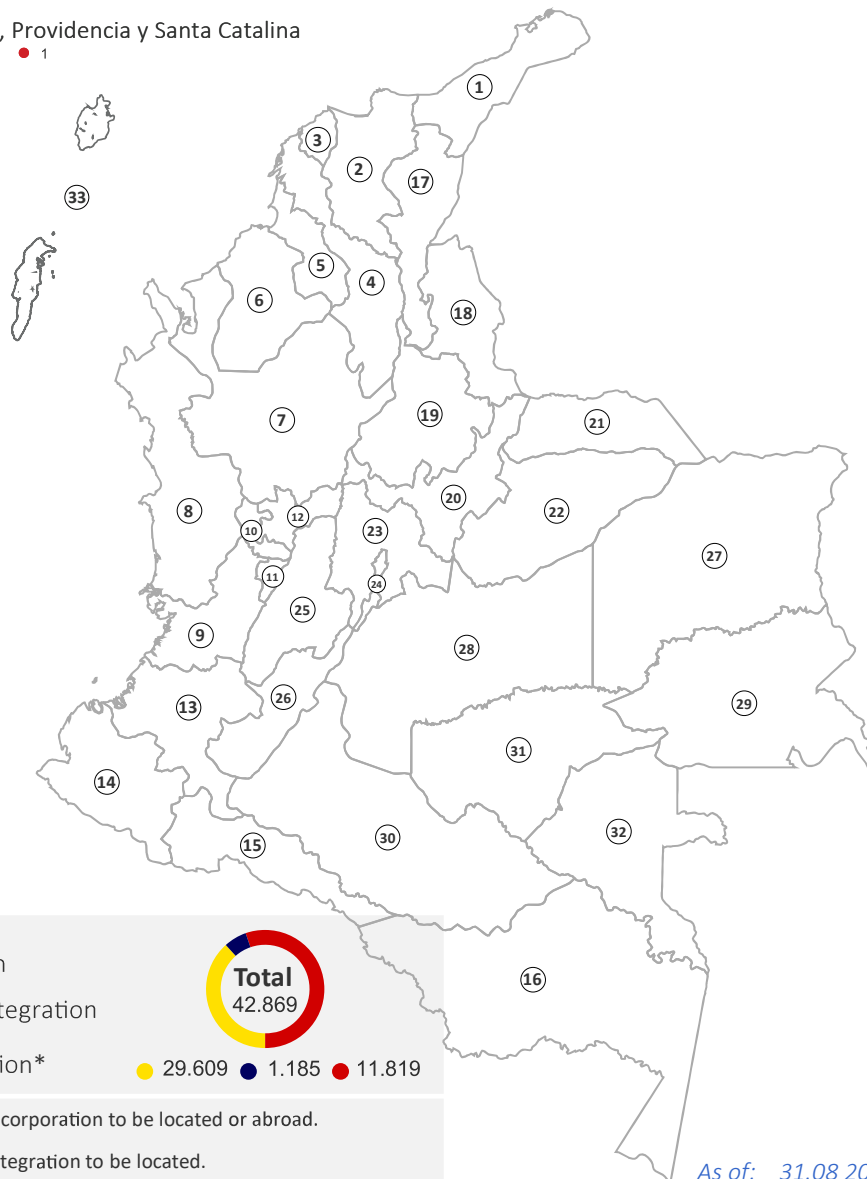

People in the reintegration, special reintegration and reincorporation processes by department

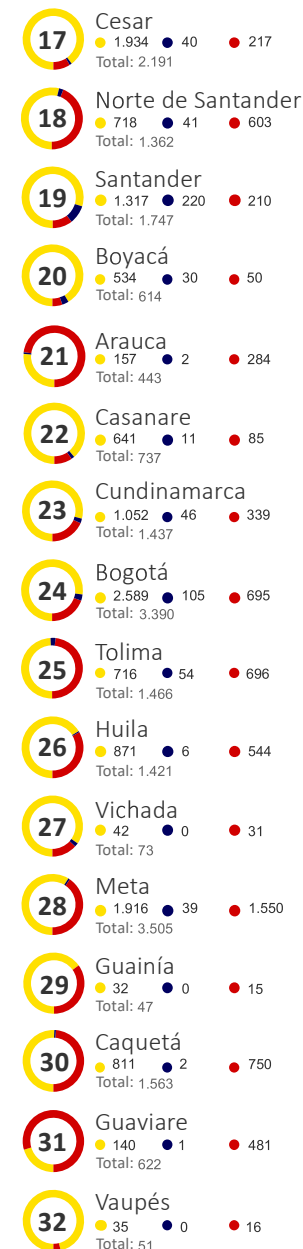
People who are currently served by ARN and who finished their regular reintegration process

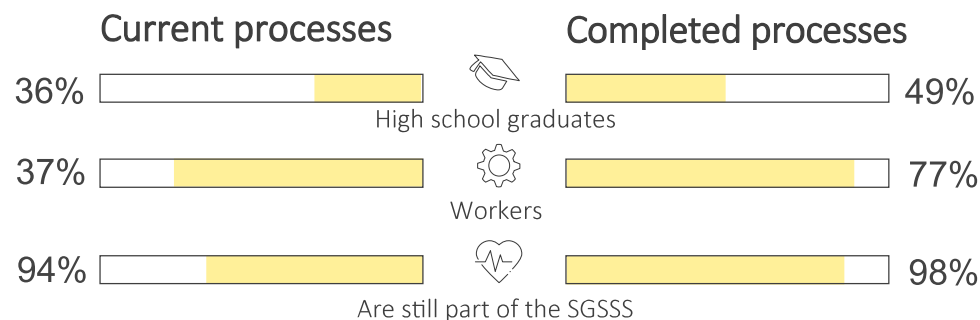

Development of life skills

We generate abilities that facilitate the economic insertion of people who are part of the reintegration process:

► Training for Employment

72% of people who have completed the reintegration process have been trained on employment skills.

► Economic Insertion Benefits

They provide access to a source of income generation through three lines: economic incentive to employability, business plans and higher education

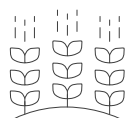
