#### **Vision**

### Together for the future

For the sustainability of the reintegration and reincorporation processes it is necessary the participation of the public and private sectors, academia, the third sector and international cooperation. In order to generate allianc-es that provide opportunities for ex-combatants.



### Regular Reintegration

This process contemplates a comprehensive approach to the people in the reintegration process and their family through eight dimensions (personal, family, health, education, production, security, citizenship and habitat), which affect the development and strengthening of capacities leading to the autonomous exercise of citizenship within the framework of legality.

### **Special Reintegration**

It promotes the reintegration of people postulated to Law 975 of 2005 once they have recovered freedom effectively through access to benefits such as psychosocial counseling, education and training for employment to allow them to continue to live under the framework of legality and meet the commitments acquired with the victims in terms of symbolic reparation.

### Reincorporation







**72%** of people who have completed the reintegration process have been trained on employment skills.
